for One Earth One Design (14300 Greenwood Ave. N., Seattle; 206.418.8120; 1earth1design.com) were sown a mere 10 months before its November 2006 opening, when owner Sandy Campbell started the Web site environmentalinteriors.com (now 1earth1design.com). Campbell, an interior designer, had been in the hotel industry and was bothered by the wasteful way many hotels dispose of slightly worn items. "It made me think about what was in all those products going into landfills," says Campbell. The Web site, and later the retail store (which shares the name with an interior design business of the same name), are the result of Campbell's effort to make eco-conscious products available to the public. "The store is set up like a Northwest primary home," says Campbell, with a staged living room, kitchen, bedroom and working bathroom to provide inspiration. **Owner's Favorite Item:** Ladybug Vaporizer (\$699-\$1,699)



The Northwest is known for its magnificent trees, and if Jim Newsom, founder of **URBAN HARDWOODS** (4755-C Colorado Ave. S, Seattle; 206.766.8199; urbanhardwoods.com) has his way, none of them will go to waste. The self-taught woodworker began crafting reclaimed trees into weighty, one-of-a-kind furniture in the 1990s, salvaging beached logs from the shores of Elliott Bay with his tugboat. Today most of the salvaged trees that he transforms into treasures are cut down by local tree service companies, utility crews and building contractors. Many of Newsom's high-end coffee and dining tables are on display at his showroom, or you can choose to have a custom piece created from a selection of wood slabs. In the spirit of sustainability, only natural wax finishes are used, although darkening effects can be added with a torch. *Tip:* Urban Hardwood will salvage an older hardwood (not fir or cedar) of at least 30 inches in diameter if you have a tree-removal service take it down.

On the prowl for an old-school clawfoot tub or a vintage medicine cabinet? You'll find it at **EARTHWISE ARCHITECTURAL SALVAGE** (3447 Fourth Ave. S, Suite E, Seattle; 206.624.4510; earthwise-salvage.com). The store offers salvaged building materials and architectural features, mostly from the 1950s or earlier, from area homes and buildings (including the old Seattle Opera House).

GREENER LIFESTYLES (5317 Ballard Ave. NW, Seattle; 206.545.4405; greenerlifestyles.com) carries contemporary 100 percent natural, free-trade home furnishings, organic sheets, sustainable flooring and furnishings for every room of the home, and shows that high style and high ideals can co-exist peacefully.
